

## How to get to Salisbury

### From London:

From M3 take Junction 8 onto A303. Then take A343 (via The Wallops) to Salisbury (or A338 via Cholderton or A345 via Amesbury). 84 miles.

### From Amesbury/Stonehenge:

Take A345 to Salisbury, drive past Old Sarum and arrive on Castle Road/Castle Street. 8/10 miles.

### From Bournemouth:

Take A338 from Bournemouth straight to Salisbury, through Downton, passing the Britford Park & Ride on your left. Enter Salisbury on New Bridge Road. 27 miles.

### From Southampton:

Leave M27 at Junction 2 onto A36, enter Salisbury on the Southampton Road. 22 miles.

### From Bath:

Take A36 (East) and enter Salisbury on the Wilton Road. 41 miles.

# Welcome to Salisbury

This guide has been produced to help you get the most out of your visit to Salisbury and to make finding your way around the city as easy as possible.

There are two main coach parks for your use - the Millstream Coach Park and new facilities at Britford Park & Ride. Salisbury's designated drop-off and pick-up point is on St John Street (just outside the Cathedral Close), where you can stop for 10 minutes. During the summer months our Coach Ambassador will be on hand to give you information and directions to both Millstream Coach Park and Britford Park & Ride Site.

For the most up-to-date parking information, please call Salisbury Tourist Information Centre on 01722 334956. Our City Ambassadors, dressed in a green uniform, will also be pleased to help you and you'll find them on duty all year round.

## Shopmobility

If you have passengers that need a little more help in getting around and about, then Shopmobility will be pleased to assist you! Give them a call on 01722 328068, at least 24 hours in advance, and they will arrange for a wheelchair or scooter to be delivered to the Coach Park in time for your arrival. Any vehicle will cost £1 per hiring and borrowers must register with Shopmobility, located in the Maltings. This will only take a few minutes.

We hope that you and your passengers enjoy your visit and that this guide helps you to have a trouble-free time.

## Millstream Coach Park

23 coach spaces

A Coach Drivers' Rest Room is available for your use, with comfortable seating, television and a vending machine for snacks and drinks. There is a security key pad on the door and to register for the code, please call Salisbury Tourist Information Centre on 01722 334956.

## Recommended routes

The map on the right shows our recommended routes to reach the drop-off point in St John Street and then to the Millstream Coach Park (follow green route) or Britford Park & Ride (follow blue route). For coaches over 4.4m (14' 6") please note the height restriction in Castle Street.

## Britford Park & Ride

18 coach spaces

Just over one mile from the city centre, Britford is especially convenient if you are visiting from south of the city. Drop off and pick up your guests on St John Street, park at Britford and use your free bus ticket into the city.

If you prefer to stay at Britford, the waiting room in the terminal building has chairs which you are welcome to use.
