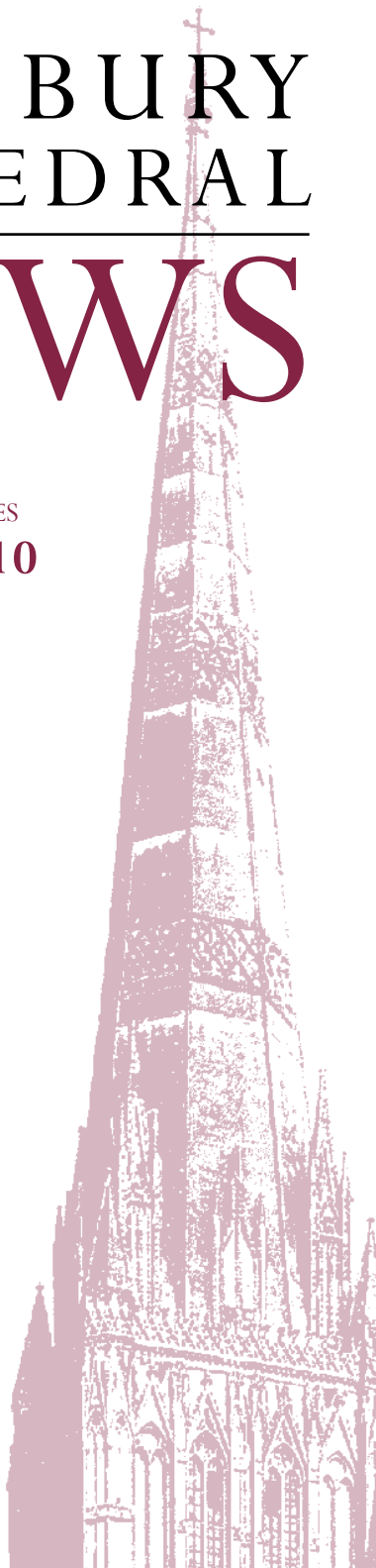

Threatened, Nepal

Rita Mahato has received threats of death, rape and kidnap as a result of her work assisting women who have suffered from acts of violence. She is a health counsellor with the Women's Rehabilitation Centre (WOREC) in Nepal, which investigates and documents cases of sexual violence and provides legal and other support to victims.

In June 2007, Rita was threatened with rape and death when her office in eastern Nepal was attacked by men from her community. When staff went outside to confront the group, bricks were thrown at them. The police have taken no action either to investigate the incident or to provide Rita with protection and Rita continues to receive threats in connection with her work. As a result, she fears for her life.

Women human rights defenders in Nepal are often harassed, humiliated and even killed for the work they do. Many have become social outcasts for raising issues of domestic and sexual violence.

APPEAL: Please write calling for a thorough impartial investigation into the threats against Rita Mahato and the attacks on the staff and offices of WOREC. Urge the Nepalese authorities to do everything possible to ensure that women human rights defenders can carry out their work without fear of reprisals. Call for the development of a national plan of action to implement the UN Declaration on Human Rights Defenders.
