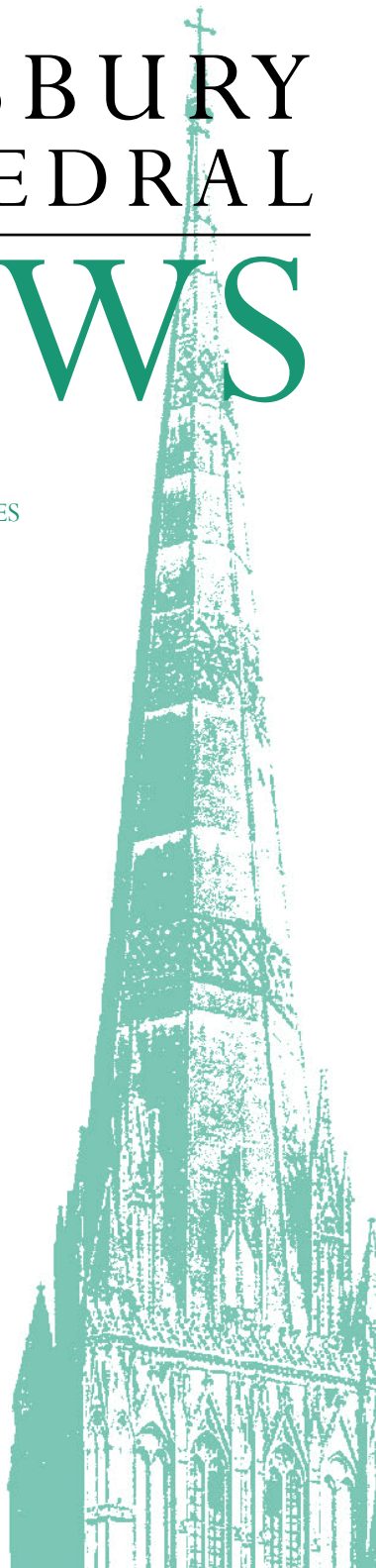

AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL

Religious Leader Persecuted, Eritrea

Abune Antonios, 81, Patriarch of the Eritrean Orthodox Church, has been detained since 28 May 2007 at an undisclosed location in the Eritrean capital Asmara.

Amnesty International considers him to be a prisoner of conscience and believes that he has been refused medical care for diabetes.

Abune Antonios had resisted government interference in religious affairs and in 2004 protested at the detention of three Orthodox priests who had secret prison sentences imposed on them. In January 2005, church authorities removed his executive powers, seemingly because of his protests against government policy.

In January 2006, he was put under house arrest. He is one of approximately 2,000 members of religious groups detained in Eritrea, many held in remote army camps and metal shipping containers.
