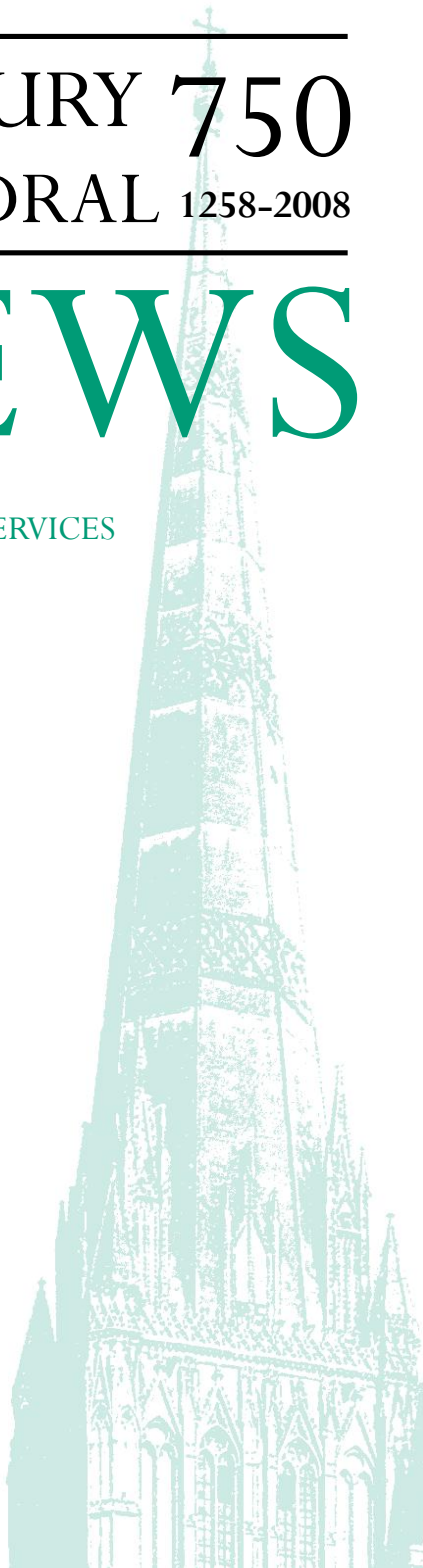

The Dean explained, "These awards are intended to be presented annually to those who Chapter consider have given exemplary and outstanding service to the Cathedral. The foundations of our life here are constantly secured and re-laid by our lay community and these Awards are given to those who have not necessarily worked the longest but have all gone the 'extra mile', used their skills and initiative and done good – even great – things for our Cathedral. I think they would probably say that it's been a privilege to serve the Cathedral but our life has also been blessed by them. Although in the future we will be awarding just one or two St Osmund Awards a year, as this is our 750th Anniversary year we are indulging ourselves by giving certificates to ten hugely deserving individuals."
