April Prisoner of Conscience: French-Palestinian lawyer Salah Hammouri has been issued a four-month administrative detention order. He is a field researcher for Palestinian NGO Ad-dameer and has been held without charge or trial since the 7 March. Since 2002, Israeli authorities have persistently harassed Hammouri, who has been detained several times. He is also at risk of deportation as Israel's Ministry of Interior has taken action to revoke his residency status in East Jerusalem. The Israeli authorities must release Hammouri immediately and ensure that he is allowed to keep his residency status in Jerusalem and continue with his human rights work without fear of reprisals.

The chalice is now being offered once again at The Eucharist. Those who feel comfortable to receive in two kinds are now able to do so. A chalice will be administered at all of the communion stations. If you wish to receive consecrated wine then please do so directly from the chalice; the practice of intinction, of dipping consecrated bread into the wine, creates a risk of infection and is not permitted. Please come forward to receive wearing a mask, remove it once at the front of the queue before receiving the sacrament, and replace it to walk back to your seat. Those who do not yet feel comfortable can continue to receive in one kind only.

Staying Safe. Please continue to wear masks whilst moving around inside the Cathedral, including to go up to receive communion. Masks are not required whilst at your seat or to sing. Please do not attend worship if you have Covid symptoms.

2022 Organ Festival. Tickets for the 2022 Organ Festival are now available on the cathedral website. The funeral of Canon Gwyneth Evans, will be on Thurs 5th May, at 10am, in the Quire.

A retiring collection following the Holy Week concert given by the Cathedral Choir, **Lo, the Full, Final Sacrifice**, raised £2,240 for Ukraine. The money will be donated to the Disaster Emergency Committee Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal, a group of 15 humanitarian aid charities set up to raise funds quickly and efficiently in times of crisis overseas. Each of the 15 charities are experts in humanitarian aid and specialise in different areas of disaster response. Canon Edward Probert, Canon Chancellor, said: "We are grateful for the generosity of our concert-goers, who collectively donated such a huge amount in the course of a single evening. The money is sent with our prayers to those who are suffering in the Ukraine."
