## Cathedral Notices

**Staying Safe.** It is no longer necessary to wear a mask whilst attending Cathedral worship. However, those administering communion will continue to wear masks during the distribution of communion. Please feel free to wear a mask or not, as you prefer.

**The chalice is now being offered once again at The Eucharist.** Those who feel comfortable to receive in two kinds are now able to do so. A chalice will be administered at all of the communion stations. If you wish to receive consecrated wine then please do so directly from the chalice; the practice of intinction, of dipping consecrated bread into the wine, creates a risk of infection and is not permitted. Those who do not yet feel comfortable can continue to receive in one kind only.

**Please note** there will be no coffee served following the 10:30 am Ordination service today as it is a much longer service than the regular Sunday Eucharist.

**Concert with St John Singers and Cathedral Youth Choir:** Two local choirs will combine for a concert on Sat 9th July, 7.30pm, at St Thomas's Church. Directed by Stephen Abbott and accompanied by Ben Maton, the **St John Singers** and the **Cathedral Youth Choir** will join forces to perform John Rutter's *The Sprig of Thyme* (a collection of eleven beautiful folk-song arrangements) and anthems by David Halls, Christopher Fay, Richard Shephard, and the late Barry Makin; and *In Our Service*, commissioned by the RSCM to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee of HM The Queen, and composed by Thomas Hewitt-Jones. **Organ Festival:** Following a great concert by Katherine Dienes two weeks ago, our Organ Festival continues through July and August with three exciting events. On Sunday 10 July at 15:45, the Sunday Organ Music series continues with Sam Bristow playing the mighty Fantasy and Fugue on 'Ad nos' by Liszt. This is a fantastic opportunity not only to hear this epic work in its entirety (around 30 minutes' duration) but to hear Sam before he leaves us at the end of term to become Organist of St Matthew's, Westminster. On Saturday 23 July we welcome the incredibly talented Anna Lapwood to the cathedral, who will give an evening concert on the Willis organ at 19:00.
