October Prisoner of Conscience: Mohammad bin Nasser al-Ghamdi has been sentenced to death in Saudi Arabia for peaceful online activity on Twitter and YouTube. The charge sheet cited posts in which he criticized the Saudi King, Crown Prince and Saudi's foreign policy. This death sentence marks the crackdown on any form of dissent to the Saudi authorities. He has a total of 10 followers across his platforms.
