**November Prisoner of Conscience:** Mahmoud Hussein from Egypt, a protester who had already spent two years in arbitrary pretrial detention for wearing an anti-torture T-shirt, was re-arrested on 30 August. After his release on bail in 2016, he was convicted of bogus charges and sentenced to life imprisonment in his absence in an unfair trial by an emergency court marred by allegations of torture. He is detained pending his retrial, amid concerns over his health. He must be immediately and unconditionally released.
