January Prisoner of Conscience: Ana da Silva Miguel (also known as Neth Nahara), was arrested in Luanda, Angola. On 14 August she was convicted to 6 months in prison for recording a live video on TikTok criticising the president. Following an appeal by the public prosecutor in September, her sentence was increased to 2 years in prison. Since her arrest, Nahara has been denied access to her daily medication and in December was hospitalised due to her deteriorating health. Her conviction and sentence stem from the peaceful exercise of her right to freedom of expression. Neth Nahara must be immediately released.

An Introduction to the Gospel of Mark. Tues 23 Jan 2024, 7.30–8.45pm in Sarum College. (This is a re-rerun for those unable to get seats at the November session.) Led by Canon Treasurer Kenneth Padley. Mark's gospel, from which most Sunday morning gospel readings will be taken in 2024, is the earliest life of Jesus and so vital to our understanding of his life and mission. This evening will consider the structure of Mark and its core themes – secrecy and proclamation, exorcism and conflict, faith and doubt. Edward Burne-Jones: Windows to the Soul Talk. Thurs 1 Feb 2024 at 7pm in the North Transept. Our 19th Century stained-glass window in the South Quire Aisle, designed by eminent Pre Raphaelites, Sir Edward Burne-Jones and William Morris, needs vital work to restore it to its original beauty. In this talk, Nicholas Tromans, an expert in nineteenth-century British art, will introduce this important conservation project.

Nicholas Tromans has worked in universities, museums, and auction houses. He is the author of many books and articles on artists including Richard Dadd, G. F. Watts, and William Holman Hunt. He was one of the contributors to the catalogue of Tate Britain's 2018 Burne-Jones exhibition.

In the Footsteps of St Peter: A Pilgrimage to Rome, 18–24 May 2025. The Revd Maggie Guillebaud, assisted by Canon Probert, will lead a pilgrimage to Rome to search out the very earliest evidence of Christianity in that iconic city, not least the presences of Sts Peter and Paul who helped shape early Christian life there. We shall visit not only C4th churches, often built over the sites of the martyrdom of early Christian converts, but also the Catacombs and the Scavi beneath the high altar of St Peter, where some believe the bone of St Peter have been found. We shall be staying at the charming convent of Santa Brigida in the centre of Rome. This pilgrimage will be strenuous. It will be hot, we shall be walking on cobbled streets, and we shall be going up and down many steep staircases to reach these early sites.
