February Prisoner of Conscience: Human rights defender and prisoner of conscience Mohammed al-Roken is among 87 Emirati men being prosecuted in a new case on trumped up terrorism-related charges. Their trial, which began on 7 December before the Federal Appeal Court in Abu Dhabi, includes 62 unjustly imprisoned victims of the 2013 mass trial, known as the UAE94, 59 of whom remain arbitrarily detained after serving their sentences.

Salisbury Cathedral Choir are joined by a professional string orchestra for their Holy Week concert performance of Sir James MacMillan's moving work *Seven Last Words from the Cross* alongside Finzi *Lo the full final sacrifice*, Halls *Elegy for Strings* and L'Estrange *Drop, drop slow tears*. The traditional text of the Seven Last Words from the Cross is based on a compilation from all four gospels to form a sequential presentation of the last seven sentences uttered by Christ.
