March Prisoner of Conscience: Umar Khalid raised his voice against religious discrimination and human rights violations. As a result, the Muslim human rights defender and scholar has been imprisoned in India, solely for peacefully exercising his rights to freedom of expression and assembly. He was arrested on 13th September 2020, accused of inciting communal violence through his speeches. He has been held in prison for three years without trial with his bail applications repeatedly rejected.
