**March Prisoner of Conscience: Umar Khalid** raised his voice against religious discrimination and human rights violations. As a result, the Muslim human rights defender and scholar has been imprisoned in India, solely for peacefully exercising his rights to freedom of expression and assembly. He was arrested on 13th September 2020, accused of inciting communal violence through his speeches. He has been held in prison for three years without trial with his bail applications repeatedly rejected.

Seven Last Words from the Cross 7.30pm, Wed 27 March. Salisbury Cathedral Choir are joined by a professional string orchestra for their Holy Week concert performance of Sir James MacMillan's moving work Seven Last Words from the Cross alongside Finzi Lo the full final sacrifice, Halls Elegy for Strings and L'Estrange Drop, drop slow tears. The traditional text of the Seven Last Words from the Cross is based on a compilation from all four gospels to form a sequential presentation of the last seven sentences uttered by Christ. This intense, moving and expressive work will form part of the Cathedral's Holy Week liturgical offering. Tickets priced from  $\pounds 10-\pounds 20$  for adults and  $\pounds 7.50$  for children, available from the Cathedral Website and Box Office.
