**April Prisoner of Conscience: Marfa Rabkova** a coordinator of the volunteer network of prominent human rights NGO Viasna, is behind bars for documenting human rights abuses. She was arbitrarily detained in September 2020 after exposing the brutality of law enforcement officers against peaceful demonstrators following the disputed presidential elections the previous month. In September 2022, she was sentenced to 15 years in prison; the Supreme Court later reduced the sentence by three months on appeal.

**Charles Villiers Stanford – A Celebration.** From 6–12 May, Salisbury Cathedral celebrates the legacy of composer Charles Villiers Stanford, who died 100 years ago in 1924. For the week, all music in services will be by Stanford and those he taught. We welcome Truro Cathedral Choir, directed by James Anderson-Besant, to sing Evensong on Monday 6th May to start the celebration. The week-long celebration will also feature:

- Wednesday 8 May – Organ concert given by John Challenger. The programme features not only Stanford's own organ music, but organ works by the composers who influenced him (the Schumanns, and Brahms) and some of the composers he taught (Coleridge-Taylor, Holst, Howells, and Vaughan Williams).

- Saturday 11 May – Choral concert given by Salisbury Cathedral Choir and the Choir of St Matthew's, Westminster. The combined choirs will sing choral works by Stanford as well as his pupils (including Holst, Howells, Vaughan Williams and Rebecca Clarke)
