April Prisoner of Conscience: Marfa Rabkova a coordinator of the volunteer network of prominent human rights NGO Viasna, is behind bars for documenting human rights abuses. She was arbitrarily detained in September 2020 after exposing the brutality of law enforcement officers against peaceful demonstrators following the disputed presidential elections the previous month. In September 2022, she was sentenced to 15 years in prison; the Supreme Court later reduced the sentence by three months on appeal.
