**May Prisoner of Conscience: Qahraman Shukri** was arrested by security forces in the Kurdistan Region of Iraq (KR-I) in Jan 2021. In June 2021, he was sentenced to 7 years in prison following a grossly unfair, secret trial. Before his arrest, Qahraman Shukri's journalism work was critical of Kurdish authorities' handling of Turkish air strikes in the KR-I. His arrest is in the context of a wider crackdown by Kurdish authorities on the right to freedom of expression.
