May Prisoner of Conscience: Qahraman Shukri was arrested by security forces in the Kurdistan Region of Iraq (KR-I) in Jan 2021. In June 2021, he was sentenced to 7 years in prison following a grossly unfair, secret trial. Before his arrest, Qahraman Shukri's journalism work was critical of Kurdish authorities' handling of Turkish air strikes in the KR-I. His arrest is in the context of a wider crackdown by Kurdish authorities on the right to freedom of expression.

Stanford – A Celebration. Celebrating the legacy of composer Charles Villiers Stanford, who died 100 years ago in 1924, from 6–12 May all music in services will be by Stanford and associated composers. We start the week with Evensong sung by Truro Cathedral Choir on Mon 6 May. The week-long celebration will also feature:

• Wed 8 May – Organ concert given by John Challenger. The programme features not only Stanford's own organ music, but works by those who influenced him (the Schumanns, and Brahms) and some of the composers he taught (Coleridge-Taylor, Holst, Howells, and Vaughan Williams).

• Sat 11 May – Choral concert given by Salisbury Cathedral Choir and the Choir of St Matthew's, Westminster. The combined choirs will sing choral works by Stanford as well as his pupils (including Holst, Howells, Vaughan Williams and Rebecca Clarke)
