## Organ Restoration

The start to 2019 has been most interesting at the Cathedral. Until a few weeks ago, organ pipes of all sizes, along with other components, were being removed and packed to be sent to the workshop of Harrison & Harrison in Durham. The liturgy throughout January and early February had to be altered (often substantially) owing to scaffolding in the Quire. This scaffolding came down during the week of 11 February and we were able to return to normality by the end of that week. The scaffolding in the aisles will stay up until the restoration is complete, and some organ pipes are being stored up there. The restoration activity in the Cathedral has quietened down, as the majority of this work is being undertaken in Durham.

However, there are still things to see here. In mid-February our exhibition 'Pulling out the Stops' was completed in the North Transept, and this is well worth a visit if you have not done so yet. We are hugely indebted to our consultant, Dr Alexandra Woodall, RFA Design and all the Cathedral staff involved, for creating such an amazing exhibition which aims to speak to a diverse audience about our Cathedral's great Father Willis Organ and the restoration process. The exhibition contains interactive elements in the form of an organ model, which shows a cross-section of the mechanics of a pipe organ, and a virtual Salisbury Cathedral organ, which allows visitors to play the Salisbury Cathedral organ via a touch screen. For this virtual organ we are hugely indebted to the Hauptwerk company, who sampled every single pipe on the Salisbury organ some years ago and who have supplied the software for our exhibition.

For obvious reasons there will be no organ recital series this year, but in its place we have organised a South Transept Recital Series. These recitals will take place monthly and further details may be found on the Cathedral website. We look forward to welcoming some distinguished musicians and, in each recital, the musicians will speak about the music, often in the form of a talk. Refreshments are available following each recital and we do encourage you to join us.
