**November Prisoner of Conscience:** Ahmed Souab, a 68-year-old lawyer and human rights defender, has been arbitrarily detained since April 2025 for his work defending victims of human rights violations and the legitimate exercise of his right to freedom of expression. He now faces trial based on unfounded terrorism charges for comments he made criticising the lack of due process and violations of fair trial rights in the so-called “conspiracy case” trial, in which he represented several defendants. Tunisian authorities must immediately release Ahmed Souab, drop all charges against him, and end the misuse of terrorism-related legislation to silence peaceful dissent and opposition voices.

### Cathedral Notices

**Regular giving update.** Thank you to all who responded to the Cathedral's giving campaign in June. Our aim was to encourage new members to become regular supporters through the Parish Giving Scheme (PGS), and for existing supporters to review their support and transfer to PGS if they still give by standing order.

Your generosity and response have driven success: overall regular giving is up 10% on last year – and 30% up on where we were before the 2023 campaign. We have also tipped the balance with more than half of regular donors now giving through PGS. We have been asked to clarify after last summer's campaign: funds given through PGS go to support ministry at and through the Cathedral - worship, faith nurture, and pastoral care; restricted support (e.g. for our music or buildings) can be offered separately through our website.
