December Prisoner of Conscience: Sonia Dahmani, a lawyer and media personality, has been arbitrarily detained since May 2024 for peacefully expressing her right to freedom of expression speaking out on racism, migration, and prison conditions in Tunisia. She faces five prosecutions and is enduring cruel, inhumane detention conditions that seriously threaten her health. Authorities have charged her under a repressive cybercrime law for 'spreading false news'. Sonia is one of dozens of people targeted for criticising the government, and her case reflects the sharp decline of free expression and judicial independence in Tunisia. Sonia Dahmani must be immediately released, and all charges against her dropped.
