March Prisoner of Conscience: Moussa Tchangari, Secretary-General of Alternative Espaces Citoyens, is one of Niger's most prominent civil society leaders. He has long worked to promote human rights, civic dialogue, and democratic values. On 3 December 2024, he was arrested, which we believe to be motivated by his public statements on governance and politics in Niger. He has been held in detention and faces charges with no credible evidence, solely for the peaceful exercise of his right to freedom of expression. He has been charged with advocating terrorism and criminal association in connection with terrorism, "infringing on national defence" and "intelligence with enemy countries". Moussa Tchangari's arrest is a worrying signal for all citizens who wish to participate in public debate and defend democratic principles without fear of repression. We demand the immediate release of Moussa Tchangari, and call upon Niger's authorities to drop all charges against him.

Praying for the Archbishop and all who lead in the Church and the World On Tuesday 24 March the Cathedral is dedicating an hour to prayer for Archbishop Sarah and for all who are called to the complex demands of leadership in these uncertain times. Join us in the Trinity Chapel between 11.30–12.00 for silent prayer. At 12.00, the Bishop will preside at a celebration of the Eucharist (within which the Dean will offer a homily). Please come and, if you are unable to, please make space on this day to pray for our new Archbishop and for all who lead.

Praying the Psalms of the Passion: Quiet Time in Holy Week. The poetry of the psalms-familiar to Jesus from his childhood - surrounds the climactic events of Holy Week. The Last Supper concludes with the singing of a psalm; in his agony Jesus speaks words of psalmody from the cross. In this Quiet Morning for Holy Week the Dean will offer a series of short addresses, pointing to rich seams for contemplation in the days ahead. These will be interspersed with quiet, with a chance to walk in the Cathedral Close, and with opportunities to pray alone and together. Sarum Master Bible. Many will remember the Cathedral acquisition of the Sarum Master Bible in December 2024, following a fundraising campaign run by Friends of the Nations' Libraries. The beautifully-illustrated manuscript Bible was made probably in Salisbury in the 1240s or 1250s. The manuscript will be on display in the Cathedral from 20 March until 17 April. On Friday 17 April at 7.30pm there will be a lecture about the Sarum Master Bible given by Professor Michelle P. Brown, former Curator of Illuminated Manuscripts at the British Library. Tickets are free but must be booked in advance. Information and ticketing is via the Cathedral Website, under "What's On".

From the Dean: our Precentor, Canon Anna Macham, has been granted Extended Ministerial Development (sabbatical) Leave, and will be away from the Cathedral for three months in Eastertide. Her last Sunday will be 26 April, and she will return on Sunday 16 August. During her absence the Vicar of the Close will work an additional day each week.
