April Prisoner of Conscience: On 13 March 2026 the Tunis Court of Appeal sentenced Abir Moussi to 10 years in prison on the basis of unfounded accusations of attempting to change the form of the state and 'inciting violence' and disorder. In addition to an existing 2 year sentence, the Tunis Court of First Instance sentenced her in December 2025 to 12 years imprisonment following an unfair trial based on the same accusations. Abir Moussi has been unjustly imprisoned since 3 October 2023 after she attempted to submit an appeal against presidential decrees on electoral districts. The Tunisian authorities must immediately release Abir Moussi and drop all charges against her as she is imprisoned solely on the peaceful exercise of her human rights.

Alleluia! Christ is Risen: An Easter Carol Service A service of Easter readings and poetry interspersed with musical items. The service includes congregational carols alongside anthems sung by the Cathedral Choir. This year's Carol Service will feature Vaughan Williams' Five Mystical Songs: settings of poems by George Herbert. Among them is Herbert's 'Rise Heart' offering a moving reflection on the hope of the resurrection. The preacher will be Canon Professor James Woodward, Principal of Sarum College. This service will be held on Sunday 26 April at 17:00.

Evensong on Tuesday 28 April will mark the 30th anniversary of the ministry of the Cathedral's Deanery Intercessors: please do join us in the celebration of this milestone. On 28.4.96, Dean Hugh Dickinson inaugurated our very first Cathedral Deanery Intercessors and this work of prayer has continued uninterrupted ever since. Our Cathedral intercessors pray daily for the Rural Deans and Lay Chairs of the nineteen deaneries, and for the individual churches, people, initiatives and events within them.

Early Music Weekend On 2-3 May, we celebrate the Corfe family of Salisbury, who played a prominent role in music in both the Cathedral and the City of Salisbury in the 18th and 19th centuries. Joseph Corfe served the Cathedral as chorister and lay vicar, and was appointed Cathedral organist in 1792, followed by his son Arthur Thomas Corfe, who was Cathedral Organist for 58 years. In 2019, the Corfe family descendants donated their collection of music to the Cathedral. Weekend events will include:

Talk: Mr Corfe of Salisbury. Musical notes and anecdotes from Georgian Salisbury. Free with admission to the Cathedral, Saturday 2 May 2pm

Concert: Music from the Corfe Family Music Collection performed by Salisbury Baroque. Tickets via the Cathedral website, £15 adults/£7.50 children (5-17) and students.

Sunday 3 May, 6.30pm

Much of the music performed at the sung services during the weekend will come from the Corfe Family Music Collection and from contemporary sources.
