April Prisoner of Conscience: On 13 March 2026 the Tunis Court of Appeal sentenced Abir Moussi to 10 years in prison on the basis of unfounded accusations of attempting to change the form of the state and 'inciting violence' and disorder. In addition to an existing 2 year sentence, the Tunis Court of First Instance sentenced her in December 2025 to 12 years imprisonment following an unfair trial based on the same accusations. Abir Moussi has been unjustly imprisoned since 3 October 2023 after she attempted to submit an appeal against presidential decrees on electoral districts. The Tunisian authorities must immediately release Abir Moussi and drop all charges against her as she is imprisoned solely on the peaceful exercise of her human rights.

Alleluia! Christ is Risen: An Easter Carol Service A service of readings and poetry interspersed with congregational carols and anthems sung by the Cathedral Choir. This year's service features Vaughan Williams' Five Mystical Songs: settings of poems by George Herbert. Among them is Herbert's 'Rise Heart' offering a reflection on the hope of the resurrection. The preacher is Canon Professor James Woodward, Principal of Sarum College. Today at 5pm.

Evensong on Tuesday 28 April marks the 30th anniversary of the ministry of the Cathedral's Deanery Intercessors: please do join us in the celebration of this milestone. On 28.4.96, Dean Hugh Dickinson inaugurated our very first Deanery Intercessors and this work of prayer has continued ever since. Our intercessors pray daily for the Rural Deans and Lay Chairs of the nineteen deaneries, and for the individual churches, people, initiatives and events within them.

Early Music Weekend 2-3 May celebrates the Corfe family who played a prominent role in music in the Cathedral and across Salisbury in the 18 & 19th centuries. Joseph Corfe served as chorister, lay vicar and organist, retiring in 1792. His son Arthur Thomas Corfe then served as organist for 58 years. The Corfe family donated their music collection to the Cathedral in 2019. Weekend events will include:

- Talk: Mr Corfe of Salisbury. Musical notes and anecdotes from Georgian Salisbury. Free with admission to the Cathedral, Saturday 2 May, 2pm
- Concert: Music from the Corfe Family Music Collection performed by Salisbury Baroque. Tickets via the Cathedral website, £15 adults/£7.50 children (5-17) and students. Sunday 3 May, 6.30pm

Much of the music performed at the sung services during the weekend will come from the Corfe Family Music Collection and from contemporary sources.

Reflective Prayer will resume on Monday 4 May.

Salisbury Cathedral Choir and David Halls are joined by the period instrument ensemble Florilegium for an Easter programme of Bach's music, pairing two celebratory sacred works with one of his most famous orchestral pieces, Orchestral Suite No.3 in D major.
