April Prisoner of Conscience: On 13 March 2026 the Tunis Court of Appeal sentenced Abir Moussi to 10 years in prison on the basis of unfounded accusations of attempting to change the form of the state and 'inciting violence' and disorder. In addition to an existing 2 year sentence, the Tunis Court of First Instance sentenced her in December 2025 to 12 years imprisonment following an unfair trial based on the same accusations. Abir Moussi has been unjustly imprisoned since 3 October 2023 after she attempted to submit an appeal against presidential decrees on electoral districts. The Tunisian authorities must immediately release Abir Moussi and drop all charges against her as she is imprisoned solely on the peaceful exercise of her human rights.

Heating The heating in the Cathedral will be turned off in the fortnight after Easter - exact date tbd by prevailing conditions. This is in line with our recent practice and environmental aspirations: even in the marginal months of April and October, heating the Cathedral for just one day emits as much carbon dioxide as it takes 24 mature trees to absorb in one year.
