**June Prisoner of Conscience:** British national, Ahmed al-Doush, has been arbitrarily detained after an unfair trial for charges based on social media use which violate his right to free expression. Saudi authorities arrested Ahmed al-Doush on 31 August 2024 at an airport in Riyadh after visiting Saudi Arabia with his wife and children. The Specialized Criminal Court, sentenced him on 12 May 2025 to 10 years in prison, shortened to eight years on appeal in June 2025, and then to five in April 2026. The UN Working Group on Arbitrary Detention recently concluded that his detention is arbitrary under international law and that he should be immediately released.
