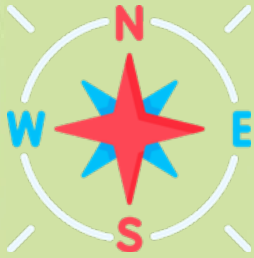

# Super Sounds Children's Trail

**1** The Cloister is a great place to test sound.

Can you clap out a simple rhythm in the Cloister?

See how far away you can be heard. Experiment with different sounds and volumes.

**2** Stomp your feet in the gravel along the West Cloister walls. Then stamp your feet on the path.

What sound does it make?  
How is the sound different?

**3** The Singing Gallery

In the past, the Cathedral choir sang praises to God through the openings from the gallery to the people below.

Listen to the special recordings by our current Cathedral choir at 9.30am, 11.30am, 1.30pm and 3.30pm\*.

**4** This megaphone sculpture was created in 2014 by Phyllida Barlow DBE.

A megaphone can help your voice sound louder and clearer.

Can you use your hands to make your own simple megaphone?

Try whispering or shouting and listen to how the sound changes.

**5** An echo is a sound that bounces back to your ears.

Stand in a corner of the building to see if you can make an echo.

Are there other places around the building where you can make an echo?

**6** Take a few moments to pause and listen. Maybe you would like to close your eyes.

Count how many different sounds can you hear? Can you tell what they are?

Why don't you explore the sounds of the Cathedral Close on another day?

The sounds that you hear in the morning can be different from the sounds in the afternoon.

The weather can change things too!
