June Prisoner of Conscience: British national, Ahmed al-Doush, has been arbitrarily detained after an unfair trial for charges based on social media use which violate his right to free expression. Saudi authorities arrested Ahmed al-Doush on 31 August 2024 at an airport in Riyadh after visiting Saudi Arabia with his wife and children. The Specialized Criminal Court, sentenced him on 12 May 2025 to 10 years in prison, shortened to eight years on appeal in June 2025, and then to five in April 2026. The UN Working Group on Arbitrary Detention recently concluded that his detention is arbitrary under international law and that he should be immediately released.

An Introduction to the Letter to the Hebrews Weds 8 July, 7pm, Trinity Chapel. The writer to the Hebrews ranks among the most accomplished first-generation Christian theologians. However, modern readers can find Hebrews difficult to access, with its complex arguments and allusions to ancient Jewish culture. Kenneth Padley, whose doctorate explored readers of Hebrews in Tudor and Stuart England will consider the original message and context of this biblical book, and unpack what it might say to us about Jesus, worship, and our ultimate destiny. The Salisbury Sudan Medical Link fundraising team would like to thank all Donors, Supporters and Volunteers for their contributions at our recent fund-raising events. The Secret Garden Teas on Sun 24 May, held at Myles Place by kind permission of John and Anne Kelly, was an extraordinarily hot day, the team held a raffle and served nearly 500 cream teas raising £3382. On Sun 7 June, the Cathedral School kindly hosted this year's Sudan fete, with proceeds benefitting the Sudan Medical link by more than £10,000. These funds will be used by the Medical Link to buy drugs and medical packs for distribution to clinics in South Sudan. The clinics in turn are able to fight diseases like Malaria and Typhoid fever, as well as reduce baby mortality by supporting birthing mothers.
